EARNINGS

Geriatric health salaries vary depending on the position, education, and the amount of experience. The average annual salary for geriatric health workers in the Imperial County ranges between \$85,000 to \$205,000.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

Certificates

The length of time it takes to get a certificate in geriatric health varies depending on the program and level of education. Undergraduate can take up to <u>6</u> months to <u>1 year</u> and for graduate which can typically takes between <u>6 months to 2 years</u> to complete.

Degree Programs

Undergraduate degree programs in geriatric health can typically take <u>4 years</u> to complete and graduate degree programs can take <u>2-5 years</u> to complete.
