## What is EOP?

EOP students are first-generation, culturally diverse and globally engaged leaders who, for nearly half a century, have helped strengthen and transform California's professional workforce.

### **History**

In April 1969, the California Legislature passed Senate Bill 1072 (the Harmer Bill) establishing the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) which was designed to provide recruitment and retention services to first-generation, low income, historically underserved students throughout the CSU System.

For more than four generations EOP programs across the state have played an instrumental role in generating a steady workforce of dynamic, globally engaged, culturally diverse and talented professionals for the state of California and for the nation.

### **Mission Statement**

The Office of Educational Opportunity Programs and Ethnic Affairs is committed to serving first generation, low income, historically underserved students by providing innovative services that facilitate the successful recruitment, retention and development of scholars and leaders as they persist toward a university degree.

San Diego State University's Office of Educational Opportunity Programs and Ethnic Affairs is one of the largest in the California State University System, serving over 3,300 students.

### San Diego State University

Founded in 1897, SDSU is the largest and oldest institution of higher learning in San Diego County, offering 90 academic majors for nearly 34,000 undergraduate students. U.S. News & World Report ranks SDSU among the top ethnically diverse campuses in the nation.

# What can EOP do for you?

Recruitment\* - Presentations, site visits, special workshops and programs for 8-12 schools, community colleges and community-based organizations. The Aztec Scholars initiative recruits prospective African American and American Indian students.

**First Contact\*** - A mandatory, free summer orientation for incoming EOP students.

Transitional Bridge Programs - Summer readiness programs for selected first time freshmen and transfer students which provide academic enrichment coursework coupled with activities to acquaint incoming students with campus life, academic programs and services.

Academic, Career and Personal Counseling - A full range of personalized support services available only to EOP students.

Retention Services\* - The Learning Support Center (LSC) provides free tutoring services for EOP students, academic monitoring, a computer lab and a study lounge.

**EOP Grant\*** - Students who complete the FAFSA early (or if AB 540 status, the California Dream Act application) may be eligible for an EOP grant. Eligibility is determined by the Office of Financial Aid & Scholarships.

California Dream Act\* - EOP services and certain types of aid are available for AB 540 students who meet the state of California's established criteria.

**Education Without Borders (EWB)** - EWB is a student organization that aims to highlight the issues affecting undocumented students and other marginalized groups, while fostering a support network that encourages diversity and access to higher education.

The Guardian Scholars Program - Assists students exiting the foster care system to achieve their academic goals. Comprehensive services include year-round housing, scholarships and personal support services.

**SOAR** - The SOAR student mentoring program provides opportunities for personal and academic growth through supportive peer relationships.

**EOP Student Advisory Board** - A student organization which advocates for students' interests and organizes enrichment activities throughout the academic year.

**Graduation Reception\*** - Upon successfully completing their undergraduate studies, students and their families are recognized at a special ceremony.

### **Eligible Applicants**

- Historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged undergraduate students with the academic potential to succeed in a university setting
- California residents or eligible AB 540 Dream Act students
- · Students who meet the established income criteria

### **EOP Income Criteria**

# EOP Priority Application: October 1 to December 15

Applications are processed on a first-come first served basis. Space is limited. Apply early in order to increase your opportunities to enroll in this program.

Students cannot apply for services once they begin their first semester of studies at a CSU campus.

### **Admission Application Fee Waiver**

Students who meet the established income guidelines may qualify for the CSU \$55 Admission Application Fee Waiver (waives up to four CSU Undergraduate Application fees). To check if you are eligible, complete the SDSU undergraduate application at www.csumentor.edu. The Application Fee Waiver is in Section 12.
